Positions Available

In 2018, there are six vacancies on the board of directors. The six directors elected in 2017 were elected to a two year term of office.

The six seats that are now open for election to the board of directors will be divided as follows:

- 2 representatives of the crop sector
- 2 representatives of the livestock sector
- 2 representatives at large

Note: Crop and livestock sector seats are designated for producer-based organizations.

Eligibility for the board of directors

To be eligible for nomination to the board of directors, an individual must be:

- Nominated by a member in good standing at the platinum, gold or silver level of membership. (Note: The nominee does not have to be a director of the nominating organization);
- Supportive of and committed to Farm & Food Care Ontario's objectives;
- At least 18 years of age;
- Not an undischarged, bankrupt nor a mentally incompetent person.

Nomination process

Platinum, Gold and Silver members may nominate a member for a spot on the board of directors. The nomination form must be signed by the proposer and the nominee. A complete nomination will include a biography and a copy of the director responsibilities and obligations document, signed by the nominee. **Nomination deadline is March 19, 2018, at 5 p.m.**

Nominations may be delivered to Farm & Food Care Ontario by email to kelly@farmfoodcare.org and must arrive by <u>March 19, 2018.</u>

Voting

Each Platinum, Gold and Silver member is entitled to one vote. Voting will take place at the Annual General Meeting on April 11, 2018. Each voting member may vote for all six positions on the provided ballots, two in each of the three categories.

Proxy

Platinum, Gold and Silver members may vote at the meeting by proxy if they are not attending in person. Notice of proxy must be in writing and delivered to the secretary no later the forty-eight (48) hours prior to the meeting.

Scrutineers

A minimum of two scrutineers will be appointed by the members at the Annual General Meeting for the purpose of counting votes in the election.

Term of Office

The regular term of office will be two years. Each year, six of the twelve seats will expire.

Director responsibilities and obligations

This document will assist members in their deliberation as they consider making and/or accepting a nomination to the board of directors.

In general, directors have the responsibility to ensure effective governance of the organization and to ensure the effectiveness, credibility and viability of Farm & Food Care Ontario. They are integrally involved in the decision-making process.

Commitment to the objectives

Directors should share a passion for and support these stated objectives:

- > To proactively communicate factual information on farm practices and food production;
- > To provide proactive leadership from the grassroots on agricultural issues;
- > To advance and promote responsible farm animal care and environmental stewardship;
- > To deliver specialized expertise and training on communications and the issues in agriculture.

Basic responsibilities

- Determine the organization's mission, purpose and strategy;
- Select the Executive Director;
- Support the Executive Director and review his/her performance;
- Enhance the organization's brand;
- Ensure effective organization and business planning;
- > Ensure and effectively manage financial resources;
- Determine and monitor the organization's programs and services;
- ➤ Ensure that appropriate policies and procedures are in place, including assessing its own performance on an ongoing basis.

Knowledge of current events

Keeping up to date with current affairs and issues, especially as they relate to the agriculture sector, is an important part of being a director.

Commitment of time & attendance

One important qualification in the role as director is mandatory attendance at the board meetings, usually held in Guelph approximately six times per year. A director can expect to devote approximately 6 - 10 hours per month of his or her time to preparing for and attending meetings, programs, and duties. This time commitment is the minimum to be expected, and depending on the individual and their appointments, can be more extensive.

Advisory councils

A director may or may not have an advisory council responsibility. Advisory councils will work closely with staff in program development and issue based discussions around environment and animal care specifically. Member organizations may choose to appoint different individual(s) to sit on an advisory council than the board based on their knowledge and interest.

Discretion and confidentiality

Directors will be exposed to confidential information during in camera sessions at board meetings, during committee meetings, or in conversation with members, officials, other directors, etc. Directors are required to be aware of the confidential nature of some information and to respect that confidentiality at all times.

Remuneration

There will be no direct or indirect remuneration for directors paid by Farm & Food Care Ontario.

Farm & Food Care Ontario Board of Directors' Code of Conduct

- 1. Although a director may be drawn from a specific interest group, directors as a whole must represent the interests of the entire membership.
- 2. Directors shall maintain the confidentiality of the details and dynamics of board discussions, as well as those items designated as confidential.
- 3. Regardless of personal viewpoint, directors shall not speak against or in any way undermine Board solidarity once a board decision has been made.
- 4. Directors are expected to attend all board meetings. Directors shall be prepared to commit sufficient time and energy to attend to board business.
- 5. Directors shall avoid, in fact and in perception, conflicts of interest and will disclose to the Chair, in a timely manner, any possible conflicts.
- 6. Directors' contributions to discussions and decision making shall be positive and constructive.
- 7. Directors' interactions in meetings shall be courteous, respectful and free of animosity.
- 8. Directors shall be prepared for meetings, having read pre-circulated material in advance of the meeting.
- 9. Directors shall participate in the organization in ways other than attending board meetings, such as committee work, industry functions, community events and membership recruitment.
- 10. The Executive Director is responsible to the entire board. Consequently, no single director or committee has authority over the Executive Director.
- 11. Directors shall not attempt to exercise individual authority or undue influence over the organization, other directors or staff.
- 12. Directors shall conduct themselves in an ethical and professional manner at all times.

Gold members receive priority invitation to new committees and strategy sessions, and two (2) complimentary registrations to the FFCO Annual General Meeting.

Two (2) complimentary Speaking Service sessions, customized rates for standard Training Workshops; all other services and publications are also available.

Silver Membership – Support of \$1,500 or greater

Silver members may appoint an individual to attend and vote at any meeting, hold any office and sit on the Farm Animal Care Advisory Council and the Farm Environment Advisory Council. Silver members receive priority invitation to new committees and strategy sessions.
