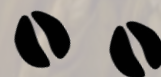

## Animal Care Advisory Council

Topics discussed by the council at its quarterly meetings in the past have included updates on the Codes of Practice, IMPACT, results from Farm & Food Care's producer attitude study, OMAFRA's animal care framework, and more. At each meeting, experts are invited to join the meeting to provide insight on agenda items. Moving forward, the advisory council will help to provide direction on the resources and training programs developed through Farm & Food Care's animal care team.
