## LIVESTOCK EMERGENCY RESPONSE COURSE

## For First Responders and Emergency Personnel

Accidents involving livestock trailers present unique challenges for First Responders. Farm animals injured or trapped and roaming loose require special consideration at accident scenes. This course will cover decision making process for accidents involving livestock trailers. Topics covered will include trailer design and extrication, animal behaviour; means to calm, rescue, capture and temporarily confine animals, laws and regulation, euthanasia protocols, and how to develop response teams. Attendees will receive one day of training in classroom and hands on in large animal rescue scene management.

A one-hour Farm Fire Education/Loss Prevention presentation is also available for \$250 plus mileage.
